## John Young History Maker Celebration Event and Scott Harris Memorial Scholarship Award Information Sheet

The Historical Society of Central Florida, Inc. established the John Young History Maker Scholarship as part of the John Young History Maker Celebration event. The John Young awards were established in 2005 in honor of Astronaut Captain John Young, the longest serving astronaut who grew up in Orlando, reflecting the mission of the History Center: To Honor the Past, Explore the Present to Shape the Future. The awards recognize individuals in Central Florida whose lifetime achievement has created a lasting positive impression in our community. The 11th Annual John Young History Maker Celebration event will be held Wednesday, April 5, 2017 in Orlando, Florida.

The Future John Young Award recognizes a Central Florida high school senior (when funding is available more than one) who is attending college/university with the goal of making a difference (making history) in future lives in a positive way. The scholarship's name was changed to recognize Scott Harris, anchorman at Central Florida News 13, who played an integral role as emcee in the program until his passing in 2011.

## **About the Orange County Regional History Center**

The Orange County Regional History Center, housed in a restored historic five-story 1927 courthouse in downtown Orlando, showcases the vast collection of the Historical Society of Central Florida, Inc. General admission is \$8; seniors (60+), students, and military with I.D. \$7; and children ages 5-12 \$6. Annual Pass Holders and children ages 4 and under are free.
